## 1. Training Course's description

This training course aims to meet the challenges of extremist violence in multicultural society settings through peace-building activities. Peace-building activities are a part of the field of peace and conflict transformation studies. In our context, peace-building activities are to be innovative activities that create a peaceful environment to meeting social, and intellectual needs of participants in resolving conflict and preventing violence. In multicultural society settings, when a conflict fueled by extremist behaviors and ideologies is not prevented, reduced or settled, it gives rise to extremist violence which is taken as a short-cut method for resolving differences.

## 2. Training Course's objectives

At the end the training course:

1. Participants are familiar with the conflict resolution and extremist violence prevention analysis, tools and techniques:
  - a. Participants will gain knowledge on the definition of conflict and violence in context of violent extremism, discrimination and advocacy of hatred;
  - b. Further, they will learn how to address the behavioural facets of conflict and violence, and how to use the tool to classifying conflicts and violence;
  - c. They will also improve their attitudes on how to create a map to illustrate the sources and pillars of a conflict as well as the elements of violence.
2. Participants develop their capacities to apply and use intercultural dialogue in countering extremist violence and hate speech:
  - a. Participants will gain knowledge on how to use the tool for conflict analysis to identify and address the roots cause of extremist violence and advocacy of hatred;
  - b. Further, they will gain skills about how to use the tool for conflict analysis to approach and deal with a conflict and differences to prevent extremist violence and hate speech;
  - c. They will also improve their attitudes on how to identify and deals with factors of extremist violence through peace-building activities: intercultural dialogue at the local level.
3. Participant are familiar with gender perspective and gender mainstreaming concepts in countering violent extremism and radicalization:
  - a. Participants will gain knowledge on how to integrate gender perspective and gender mainstreaming concepts in countering violent extremism and combating hate speech;
  - b. Further, they will gain skills about how to use gender perspective and gender mainstreaming to approach and deal with factors leading to extremist violence and hate speech;
  - c. They will also develop attitudes on how to challenge negative narratives, stereotypes, and prejudices that portray both young men and women as victims and perpetrators of violence.

## 3. Participants profile

The project Training Course seeks to develop extremist violence prevention knowledge, skills and attitudes of the staff within the consortium. It is therefore, reflected on and maintained herein that each staff within the consortium works directly with young people.

This includes but not limited to: youth volunteers: migrants, asylum seekers or refugees, and youth workers: trainers, resources developers or practitioners within the consortium.

## 4. Participants self-evaluation and YouthPass

Youthpass is a vital tool to participants' self-evaluation; to present, in a structured way their engagement in the project learning activities, and gather the data to measure the achievement of their learning goals while reflecting on their learning expectation along with some key competences.

### 5.3. Oradea

Located about 10 km (6.2 mi) from Bors, the most important crossing point on the west border (with Hungary), Oradea ranks tenth in size among Romanian cities; it covers an area of 11,556 hectares (28,560 acres). The city is at an altitude of 126 m above sea level, in the opening of the Cris valley and the plain area, in an area of contact between the extensions of the Apuseni Mountains and the extended plain Crisana-Banat. It lies as the area of transition from relief hills, to the Pannonian plain. City topoclimatic action is determined by the prevailing Western winds. Climate is Temperate Continental (Köppen climate classification Dfb), with some oceanic influences.

Oradea is the westernmost city in Romania worthwhile visiting, easy to get to from Europe, by car or train: it is located 311 km away from Budapest, about 3 hours of driving. There is also a small airport close to the city, with several daily flights from **Bucharest** as well as new routes from Barcelona or Milan (starting March 2017).

#### 5.3.1. City Highlights

The city beautifully distinguishes itself from other similar places in Transylvania, thanks to the strong influence of the nations who have lived here throughout the history. Apart from the wealthy Romanian and Hungarian heritage, both Habsburg and Italian cultures are well represented in Oradea - a city with over 900 years of history.

For me personally, Oradea is the place to be in awe with the complexity of architecture, where almost every building is worth at least a closer look if not a short visit. It is difficult to list all the astonishing places of Oradea, so here are the main landmarks not to be missed:






**Oradea Fortress**

The most imposing sight of the city, containing several art exhibitions or craft fairs throughout the year; a few hours spent here will reveal a great deal of the history of Oradea, as well as some of the most interesting medieval and modern traditions of the area.



**Ciuperca Hill**

The highest point of the city, beautiful for a nice walk and fabulous belvedere points over Oradea.



**The Moon Church**

Unique in whole Europe, containing the marvelous, gold and black astronomical clock maintained in perpetual motion and depicting the phases of the moon. Photo source: adevarul.ro



**The Roman - Catholic Cathedral**

The largest Baroque monument of Romania and one of the most impressive in Transylvania.




**The Bishop's Palace**

A fine replica of the Belvedere Palace in Vienna, it is probably the most outstanding edifice of Oradea, and the nicest Baroque masterpiece in SE Europe.



**Union Square**

The most popular meeting place in Oradea, recently renovated, encompassing no less than seven architectural styles representative for the city's complexity.



**Republicii street** - among my favorite pedestrian streets in Romania (together with the one in Brasov with the same name), it displays some of the most beautiful Art Nouveau buildings in the country, as well as great shopping and dining opportunities.

Oradea could be called the heart of Art Nouveau in Romania. Numerous historical buildings that decorate our city, proudly bear this Art Nouveau architectural style. This style has developed from 1880 until the beginning of World War I in Western Europe and the United States.

Several of the Art Nouveau buildings in Oradea: Greco-Catholic Episcopal Palace, Poynar House, Astoria Hotel, Black Eagle Palace, Fuchsl House, Ullmann Palace, Okanyi-Schwartz Villa. Well-defined features: lack of symmetry, curved lines, floral and vegetal decorations.

*The Black Eagle Palace* - the city's sight for entertainment, a 100-year old Y-shaped colorful masterpiece, where surprisingly nightlife is at its best thanks to the numerous cafes, bars and clubs within.




Figure 2 Episcopal Greeck-Catholic Palace
